

Numismatics as A Source of Investments III

Friends, in the previous Newsletter I touched upon different reasons which can help collectors to enhance their collectibles. The resources through which the collection build and inherited can be helpful to/for the further generations. Also, how to withheld the knowledge of learning with Social interaction.

In this Newsletter I am addressing few points on Record keeping. Though different collectibles require different information, but here I have penned down few general checklists which are as follows:

- 1) Inscriptions
- 2) Size
- 3) Medium
- 4) Date and Grade
- 5) Ruler
- 6) Cost and Date of Acquisition
- 7) Place and Manner of Acquisition
- 8) Provenance
- 9) Inventory Number / File folder
- 10) Photographs

Inscriptions: The first question arises here is hand written or computer generated? My preference will be to use computer program which is properly backed up in case of any computer issues. It should begin with the year of acquisition followed by the individual item number. By doing this it will put you far ahead of most collectors. The more uniform, detailed and decipherable the subject is to the novice eyes, your inventory will be beter and appreciated.

Size: Size here means dimensions and weight. The Coinages though of a particular Colonial/Queen/date and weight has different mints/fonts/edges/privy marks. For eg Presidency coins, EIC and British Colonial coins. Due to Plain Edge, Vertical Milling and Oblique Milling the coins differ in Presidency coins. 1840 Cl and DL coins due to Mints have different diameters.

Medium: Here I refer to the Metal. The coin is minted in different metals viz: Brass, Copper, Lead, Tin, Nickel, Bronze, Aluminium, Copper Nickel, Brass Nickel, Gold, Silver and lately Bi Metal and Iron. The notification of Metal is necessary to understand the quality metal used to mint the coin.

Date/Grade: as the collector reallocate, rearrange and downsize his collections the item notified may change. A unique id number recorded helps to resolve. Documenting the Date (When Minted) and the Grade of the coin one owns is the most fundamental part of intelligent Collections Management. Higher the Grade Costlier is the Value. Rare/Scarce the year/date more the Cost.

Ruler: Modern technology has made the process easier then ever, and all collectors must understand the importance of proper documentation. In many coinages for eg Kutch Princely State one will find on the coin the British Monarchy ruling at that time along with the Maha rao prevailing inscribed on the coin with AD & VS on Oby & Rev.

Cost & Date of Acquisition : Here it is important to note the price you have paid for the coin. As due to many factors viz: Grade, Date/year, Auctioner's commission, Ruler and Mint, the coin price escalates. Acquisition date is important to notify the purchase appreciation & vice a versa.

Manner/Place of Acquisition: In putting & documenting each new acquisition as you proceed, it will make the process more manageable. How did you obtain the coin? From Auction Sale? From a Dealer? From a Collector or a friend. Notification is must. Place of acquisition is also important and should be mentioned. For eg: If you have bought a coin from the Auction House based at ABC City/State and if they Auction at XYZ City/State the place differs also the VAT implied also sometimes get differed. So the notification is of utmost importance.

Provenance: Here every present owner of the coin should acknowledge the previous owner of the coin. The history of ownership is necessary. For Eg: Coinages sold by Baldwins in the name of Pridmore Collections & David Fore Collections. It enhances the the value of acquisition. As it is a Brand Name.

Inventory number/File folder: Your inventory system must be self explanatory because you may not be their to explain it. Highly specialized Jargon {words used by particular group}, abbreviations & personal notation codes should be avoided. When you sell or otherwise remove an item from your collections, make certain that it is noted clearly in your inventory.

Photography: When photographing a coin, write its unique id on a piece of paper and place it in the picture field so that the photograph actually snows the coin and the number. That way, any loose photograph can be easily identified.

Finally maintain a second copy of your complete inventory with photographs, in a different location from the collection itself.
