





## Rarity

How do you come to a conclusion that a particular coin is common, scarce or rare, I look at it in this way; rarity of a coin depends upon how difficult is the accessibility of a specific coin, how many times have you physically seen that specific coin or just heard about it, but still not in your collection, now that particular coin becomes rare, e.g. 1840 William IV Rupee, 1880 Victoria Empress <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> & <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Rupee, 1911 George V <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Rupee, 1939 George VI milled / security edge Rupee, etc. (subject to any grade). Common coins with high grades (means UNC condition) also becomes scarce or even rare as their availability is not that easy as compared to easily access of lower grade common coins, rarity of a coin can defer from collector to collector & dealer to dealer. Even mintage figures cannot be taken into consideration for rarity purpose, as minting figures are known but how many coins were issued by the mints were not known, for

example 1878 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Rupee; mintage 44,240 coins & 1880 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Rupee; mintage 821,010 coins, 1880 mintage is 20 folds higher than 1878, now just by considering mintage of 1878 1/4 Rupee than it should be rarer than that of 1880 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Rupee, but in commercial market 1880 demands few lacs of Rupees, whereas 1878 demands only few thousands, the equation applied here is of demand & supply. Second example 1925 1/4 Anna Calcutta mint mintage 14,252,800 coins, 1874 1/12 Anna Bombay mint mintage 2,960,448 coins, 1881 1/12 Anna mintage 2,953,536 coins, 1896 1/12 Anna mintage 921,600 coins, but till date not a single specimen of these years & denomination is reported. Finally rarity of a coin can change from time to time, for example 'X' coin today is rare (rarely) available means demand is much more than supply, in future the same 'X' coin supply is more than demand; in this case the rarity comes down. This process can also be vice versa.
